

Dharma Field will reopen on Sunday, July 25 for a full Sunday morning schedule.

(Note: Dharma Field will be used on July 17 by MZMC for their potluck.)

If exposed to COVID

Those who have been fully vaccinated but with no COVID-like symptoms are asked to monitor their health for the next 14 days. But they are not required to stay away from Dharma Field—the CDC has determined that they are unlikely to have been infected.

Those who have been fully vaccinated and exhibit COVID-like symptoms should not visit Dharma Field until it is certain they have not been infected or that they have recovered from the infection.

Those who have not been fully vaccinated and are with or without COVID-like symptoms should not visit Dharma Field until it is certain they have not been infected or that they have recovered from the infection.

If exhibiting COVID-like symptoms

Whether or not one is fully vaccinated, if one is exhibiting COVID-like symptoms, we ask that person not visit Dharma Field until it is certain either that the person has not been infected or has recovered from the infection.

Signage

Signs will be posted in appropriate places at Dharma Field to remind visitors of ways to help prevent the spread of COVID.

Masks

Dharma Field will not require that visitors wear masks but instead will recommend the following:

Those who have been fully vaccinated may choose whether or not to wear a facemask.

Those who have not been fully vaccinated are recommended to wear a facemask.

Free masks will be available at entrances for those who choose or are recommended to wear one but don't have one with them.

Hand sanitizer

Hand sanitizer will be available at Dharma Field entries.

Hand washing

Signs in the restroom and kitchen will remind visitors to wash their hands with warm, soapy water for at least 20 seconds.

Zendo setup

The number of cushions and chairs in the zendo will be slightly reduced so more distance can be maintained between them. Should people want to move chairs closer together, they are welcome to do so, but allowing more space between them as the default setup for the zendo will also make it possible for those still somewhat uncomfortable meeting in large groups, or who are unvaccinated, to create some distance between themselves and others.

Overflow seating will be set up in the classroom until it is no longer needed.

Ventilation

The ceiling fan will be turned on for all gatherings in the zendo. Visitors will be advised to bring warmer clothing should they find the zendo too cold.
